Sándor GALLAI,
Scientific Director, Migration Research Institute,
Professor of Corvinus University of Budapest

Sándor Gallai obtained his economics degree at the Budapest University of Economic Sciences. He received his PhD from the International Relations Doctoral School of the same university. Sponsored by various scholarships, he studied Scandinavian politics at the University of Bergen, then conducted research in Belgium and Scotland. For nearly two and a half decades he has taught several courses in political science at his alma mater, now called Corvinus University of Budapest. Apart from teaching, he also worked as a researcher, a political analyst and a head of research. Between 2010 and 2015 he served as the director general of two government think tanks active in the areas of public policy and international affairs, respectively. His main fields of research are governance and public policy in Hungary; regime changes and post-communist regimes in East Central Europe. At the Institute he is in charge of academic relations, and he also does research on the political aspects of migration.



Zoltán LOMNICI,
Professor of Pázmány Péter Catholic University

In 1979 Mr. Lomnici graduated from ELTE University, a law university, then worked as a legal Secretary in 1981, as the Pest Central District Court. Mr. Lomnici became a judge in May 1982. On the 1 May 1991, he was appointed to the Supreme Court, the Administrative College, with effect from 1 February 1998, under the direction of the administrative bodies as spokesman. On the 1st of February 2002, he was appointed to the Supreme Court. In 2002 the Parliament named him for six years as President of the Supreme Court. After the expiry of the mandate of the election of his successor in a year due to the complexities surrounding the Executive Chairman was before 2009. In 31 March 2010, the formation of the Council of the international non-governmental organisation called Human Dignity became President. He received the Radnóti Miklós anti-racism policy in 2011.



Katalin NOVÁK,
Minister of State for Family and Youth Affairs,
Ministry of Human Resources

Born in 1977, Mrs. Novak between 1992 and 1996, attended the University of Szeged. In between 1996 and 2001, she attended the Budapest University of economic sciences and public administration and obtained degree in economics. In between 1999 and 2004, the University of Szeged, Faculty of law, as well as the Université Paris X and French legal training in the community participated in Nanterre. From 2001-2010 Mrs. Novak was part of the Hungarian Ministry of Foreign Affairs, in various departments (Ministerial Cabinet, Department of EU political relations, Communication Department, European cooperation at the EU Department). From 2010 – 2012 she was a ministerial adviser, at Ministry of Foreign Affairs. From 2012-2014, head of Cabinet of Ministers, the Ministry of human resources. Finally in 2013, she became the Francophone Affairs Commissioner, at the Hungarian Ministry of Foreign Affairs.



Orsolya RÁCZ,
Analyst at Global Risk Insight, London

Orsolya RÁCZ studied Business Relations, with specialized studies in International Relations, in the International Business School of Budapest double degree that gave her the opportunity to study abroad, in the Oxford Brookes University. After she took an MSc in Politics and Communication in the London School of Economics and Political Science. With several international working experiences, Ms. RÁCZ was public relations assistant in the Saatchi and Saatchi, between 2008 and 2009, was a programme coordinator of the Institute for Cultural Diplomacy in Berlin, between 2010 and 2011, was trainee both in the European Central Bank and the European Parliament, and was a research fellow in the Szazadveg Foundation. More recently she joined the Global Risk Insights as an analyst.



Paulo RANGEL MEP,
EPN Chairman, Vice-Chairman of the EPP Group in the European Parliament
Responsible for Political Strategy and the European Ideas Network

Paulo Rangel is a Member of the European Parliament since 2009 and vice-chairman of the EPP Group, responsible for the EPP's think tank, European Ideas Network. Since 2015, Mr. Rangel is also vice-chairman of the EPP. Head of the Portuguese PSD Delegation and Administrator of the Robert Schuman Foundation, since 2009. Former Member of the Portuguese Parliament, on the 10th legislature, Mr. Rangel was the Chairman of PSD parliamentary group in 2008-2009. Prior to this, Paulo Rangel was Deputy Secretary of State in the Ministry of Justice under the 16th constitutional government.

Law graduate, by the Catholic University of Oporto. Master's in juridical-political sciences, by the University of Coimbra (in progress), and Doctorate in Public Law, by the Law faculty of Nova University of Lisbon (in progress). Lecturer of the MBA in the Porto Business School. Mr Rangel is a member of the board of directors of the Porto Trade Association, chairman of the General Assembly of RAR Group and regular commentator in various branches of media. Mr. Rangel has made many speeches and lectures, scholarly articles and books on legal, political and constitutional issues, including *Repensar o Poder Judicial*, Publicações Universidade Católica, 2001, *O Estado do Estado*, D. Quixote, 2009. Research work: with the DAAD in Frankfurt, with the European Institute in Florence, the University of Osnabrück, the University of Upsala, the University of Lausanne, the University of Bologna, the University of Genoa and the University of Freiburg. Awarded the Grosse Verdienstkreuz mit Stern by the Federal Republic of German (2009); the Council of Europe's René Cassin Prize (1989); the D. António Ferreira Gomes Prize (1986).



György SCHÖPFLIN MEP,

Born in 1939. Until 2004, György Schöpflin was a Jean Monnet Professor of Politics and Director of the Centre for the Study of Nationalism at the School of Slavonic and East European Studies, University College London. His principal area of research was the relationship between ethnicity, nationhood and political power, with particular reference to post-communism. He is the author of *Politics in Eastern Europe 1945-1992* (Blackwell, 1993) and *Nations, Identity, Power* (Hurst, 2000). He is co-editor and contributor to *Myths and Nationhood* (Hurst, 1997, with Geoffrey Hosking) and *State Building in the Balkans:*

Dilemmas on the Eve of the 21st Century (Longo, 1998, with Stefano Bianchini). His latest book, *The Dilemmas of Identity*, is forthcoming and has already appeared in Hungarian as *Az identitások dilemmája* (Attraktor, 2004). Award for International Relations of the Republic of Hungary (2011). MEP since 2004.
