**Luis AGUIAR-CONRARIA,**  
**Associate professor, School of Economics and Management of Minho University**

Luís Aguiar-Contraria is a PhD in Economics by Cornell University. He is an Associate Professor at the School of Economics and Management at the University of Minho and, currently, is the vice-dean for research of that school. One of the main topics of his research is wavelet analysis and its applications to economic data. On that topic he has published in *Journal of Economic Dynamics and Control*, *American Journal of Political Science*, *Journal of Economics Surveys*, among others.



**Kristine BERZINA,**  
**Transatlantic fellow in the German Marshall Fund of the US (GMF's), Brussels office**

Kristine Berzina completed a master's degree in international relations at the University of Cambridge. She received her bachelor's in political science and history from Yale University.

Kristine Berzina is responsible for shaping The German Marshall Fund of the United States energy programming in Europe and the United States. Berzina is an expert on transatlantic energy issues and has authored several publications about transatlantic energy trade flows, resource exploration in the Arctic, European bioenergy policy, resource efficiency, foreign policy in the Baltic States, and international affairs more broadly. Prior to joining GMF, Berzina was a Berlin-based consultant on energy and environmental policy managing projects evaluating European perceptions of U.S. liquid natural gas exports and assessing EU member state progress on resource efficiency goals. Before that, she was a transatlantic fellow at the Ecologic Institute in Berlin and worked on climate change adaptation and international development in Washington, DC.



**David CAMPBELL BANNERMAN MEP,**  
**Member of the United Kingdom Conservative Party**

Born in 1960 in Bombay, after graduating from Edinburgh University with an MA (Honours) degree, David first worked for advertising agencies and public relations companies. He went to become the Communications Director for a leading transport organisation (ATOC) and then led the website division of a leading PLC. David Campbell Bannerman, is a Conservative MEP for the East of England. He was first elected to the European Parliament in June 2009. David believes in putting his country first, before party or personal interest. He is firmly committed to common sense policies that better the lives of all the people of Britain. Mr. Campbell-Bannerman loves Europe, its peoples and cultures, but not the remote, antidemocratic and fraudulent European Union. David regards the EU as being dangerous to the shared freedoms, and destructive of our historic British identity. As a former ministerial advisor, David has served at the highest levels of the British Government. During the Irish Peace Process, David was the Special Adviser to Sir Patrick Mayhew who was the Secretary of State for Northern Ireland. He was also Chairman of the influential Bow Group think tank when it had 100 MP members and stood for the Conservative party during the 2001 General Election campaign in Warwick and Leamington.



**Angelos CHRYSOGELOS,  
Academy Senior Fellow, Europe Programme Royal Institute for  
International Affairs Chatham House**

Angelos Chryssogelos holds a BA in Politics from the University of Athens (2004), an MA in International Relations and Diplomacy from Leiden University (2008), and a PhD in Political Science from the European University Institute in Florence (2012). He has worked, among others, for the Netherlands Institute for International Affairs Clingendael, the Martens Centre for European Studies, and the University of Limerick as lecturer in European politics. His academic publications include articles for *European View*, *Southeast European and Black Sea Studies*, and *European*

*Foreign Affairs Review*; and book chapters for volumes published by Routledge and Nomos. In December 2014 he delivered a UACES Arena lecture in Brussels on the links between Russia and populist parties in the EU. His commentaries have been featured in reporting on European and Greek affairs in *Bloomberg*, *L' Echo* and *Naftemporiki*.



**Federico de MONTALVO,  
Professor, Universidad Pontificia Comillas ICAI-ICADE, Madrid**

Federico de Montalvo holds a PhD in Constitutional Law. He is an Assistant Professor of Constitutional Law; teaching both Constitutional Law and Health Law. He also has spent time in private practice and started to practice as a Lawyer and work as a Professor of Constitutional Law at the same time.

As a lawyer, he specialized in Administrative and Constitutional Law and Medical, Pharmaceutical and Biomedical Law. He founded his own law firm in 1998 which he left in 2011, having been its President for 13 years.

As a Professor specialized in Constitutional Law and Comparative Constitutional Law, he teaches on political organization and Institutions of the Constitutional State as well as human rights and civil liberties. His areas of research are Medical and Biomedical Law and Public Health Law.

He has recently taught and given lectures in De Paul University, Brooklyn Law School, Fordham University, University of York, Universidad Diego Portales, Universidad Rey Juan Carlos. He has taught Comparative Constitutional Law for fifteen years, focusing the subject mainly on the US Constitutional system. Currently he holds the Vice Chair of the Spanish Commission for Bioethical Issues (Comité de Bioética de España) (2012-) ([www.comitedebioetica.es](http://www.comitedebioetica.es)) and is member of the International Bioethics Committee (IBC) of UNESCO (2014-on-going).



**Federico FABBRINI,  
Full Professor of European Law, Dublin City University, Ireland**

Federico Fabbrini was born in 1985 and holds a B.A. in European & Transnational Legal Studies from the University of Trento (2006), a J.D. in International Law from the University of Bologna (2008) and Ph.D. in Law from the European University Institute (2012). He interned as a clerk for Justice Sabino Cassese at the Italian Constitutional Court (2010-2011) and qualified for the bar exam in Italy (2011). Before joining iCourts, he was Associate Professor of European & International Law at iCourts (the Center of Excellence for International Courts) at the Faculty of Law of the University of Copenhagen, in Denmark, and Assistant Professor of European & Comparative Constitutional Law at Tilburg Law School, in the Netherlands, where he was awarded tenure. Federico Fabbrini research focuses on EU law and spans from the field of fundamental rights to Economic and Monetary Union, up to Brexit and constitutional reforms in the Eurozone. Federico has published articles in *Common Market Law Review*, *European Law Review*, *Columbia Journal of European Law*, *European Constitutional Law Review*, *Oxford Yearbook of European Law*, *Cambridge Yearbook of European Legal Studies*, *Berkeley Journal of International Law* and *Harvard Human Rights Journal*. He is the author of two monographs with Oxford University Press: *Fundamental Rights Europe: Challenges and Transformations in Comparative Perspective* (2014, the published version of his PhD thesis at the EUI), and *Economic Governance in Europe: Comparative Paradoxes and Constitutional Challenges* (2016).



**Andrea GIURICIN,  
Research Fellow at l'Istituto Bruno Leoni, Milan**

Andrea Giuricin, born in 1982, holds a Bachelor's degree in Economics at the University of Milan Bicocca with a thesis on the evolution of the European air transport market after liberalization. At the same University, he is carrying out research at RTBicocca, Ricerche Turismo e Trasporti Bicocca, following mainly the transport themes; He also collaborates with the Economics of Economics at the Faculty of Economics. Director of the Office for Spain and Portugal of the Konrad Adenauer  
Foundation (KAS)**

Wilhelm Hofmeister studied Political Sciences, Sociology and History and received his M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Mainz, Germany. He is the Director of the Office for Portugal and Spain of the Konrad Adenauer Foundation since January 2016. Before assume his current position, he was country representative of the KAS from 1988 to 1993 in Chile, then, from 1993 to 1996, he served in the department of intellectual cooperation in the headquarters of KAS in Germany, and from 1996 to 1999 as its deputy-director with responsibility for programs in Africa, Asia and Latin

America. From 1999 to 2009 was director of the study centre of the KAS in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, and from June 2009 to January 2016, he was the Director of the Regional Programme «Political Dialogue with Asia», based in Singapore.

His areas of interest are, on one hand, political development, regime transformation and the institutionalization of political parties, and party systems, and on the other hand, the international relations of the European Union.





**Edita HRDA,  
Managing Director for the Americas at the EEAS European External Action  
Service**

Born in 1963 in Prague, Czech Republic, Edita Hrdá graduated from the Faculty of Business of the University of Economics in Prague and after 1986 she worked as a translator and interpreter of German and Spanish. From 1991, she studied at the Diplomatic academy first in Madrid and then in Vienna. Prior to becoming the Executive Director for America at the EEAS, Ms. Hrdá was appointed Ambassador of the Czech Republic to the United Nations for five years, starting in 2011. Her professional experience includes important positions: Served as Chairperson of the Executive Board of UNDP, UNFPA and UNOPS in 2011 and Chairperson of the Committee for the United Nations Prize for the Population in 2013, 2014 and 2015. During her career, she was Director of the Department of America between 2004 and 2005 and Director of Multilateral Economic Affairs in 2004. She was the Ambassador of the Czech Republic in Argentina and Paraguay between 1999 and 2003. Between 1996 and 1998 Ms. Hrdá served as Director of the Central European Department, where she coordinated bilateral political relations between the countries of Central Europe and the Central European Initiative and the Visegrad Group. During the same period she was the chief negotiator of German-Czech financial compensation after the Second World War, including the negotiations for the establishment of the German-Czech Future Fund and the German- Czech Republic (1996-1998). She was Director of the Department of Latin America from 1994 to 1996 and adviser to the First Deputy Minister in 1993, after holding office posts in Germany, Austria and Switzerland in 1992. Earlier in her career she worked at the Advanced Management Institute in Prague, Czech Republic from 1990 to 1992. Ms. Hrdá is a translator and interpreter. She teaches the University the history and development policy of Latin America, diplomatic protocol and public relations.



**Craig KENNEDY,  
Senior Fellow, Hudson Institute Washington D.C.**

Craig Kennedy was born in Beresford, South Dakota, USA, in 1952. In 1974, he received a Bachelor of Arts in Civilization Studies from the University of Chicago, and in 1980 he completed a joint degree program, acquiring a Master of Arts in Social Work and a Master of Business Administration. Craig Kennedy is a senior fellow at Hudson Institute. He was the president of the German Marshall Fund for 18 years. Kennedy began his career in 1980 as a program officer at the Joyce Foundation in Chicago and grew to become the president of that organization. He left the Joyce Foundation to work for Richard J. Dennis, a Chicago investor and philanthropist and at the same time created a consulting firm working with non-profit and public sector clients before coming to the German Marshall Fund in 1995. Craig Kennedy is a partner in Creative Engagement, an advisory firm that helps governments, corporations, and non-profits reach their key audiences in innovative ways. He serves on the boards of First Solar, The US-Russia Foundation, and True North Venture Partners.



**Duarte MARQUES,**  
**Vice-President of the Instituto Francisco Sá Carneiro**

Born in 1981 in Mação, Portugal, Duarte Marques holds a bachelor degree in International Relations from the Institute of Social and Political Sciences of the University of Lisbon. At the age of 21, Duarte Marques started working in the Portuguese Council of Ministers Presidency as a political advisor of the Minister and since 2005 he has acted as head of office of the Portuguese PSD Delegation in the European Parliament. Duarte was elected for the national board of the JSD in 2006, then two years later, in 2008, Vice President and from 2010 to 2012 he became JSD's national President. He is currently a Member of the Portuguese Parliament, elected by Santarém's constituency and Vice President of the Instituto Francisco Sá Carneiro. In addition Duarte Marques is Deputy Director of HELPO, an NGO for development with projects in Portugal, Mozambique and São Tomé and Príncipe.



**Maired McGUINNESS MEP,**  
**Vice-President of the European Parliament**

Born in 1959, near Louth, very close to the border with Northern Ireland, Mairead McGuinness holds a degree in Agricultural economics from the University College Dublin, being considered an expert in European agricultural matters. After graduation she went on to a career in a number of media outlets before entering politics in 2004. An award winning journalist, commentator, radio producer and television presenter, she was first elected to the European Parliament for the Fine Gael Party, by the East constituency. Later, in 2014, she was elected by the Midlands-North-West constituency to a second term in the European Parliament. Author of the Report on the CAP and Global Food Security, McGuinness has been appointed to serve on several European Parliament committees, including the Committee on Agriculture and Rural Development and the Committee on the Environment, Public Health and Food Safety. MEP since 2004, she is Vice President of the Parliament since 2014.



**Dara MURPHY,**  
**Minister of State for European Affairs,**  
**E.U. Digital Single Market and Data Protection, Cork North Central, Ireland**

Dara Murphy was born in 1969 in Cork, Ireland. Dara has a background in business, having been self-employed for twenty years. He holds a degree in Economics from University College Cork. Mr. Murphy is the Minister of State for European Affairs at the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade and the Department of the Taoiseach. He is also Minister of State for the EU Digital Single Market and Data Protection at the Departments of the Taoiseach and Justice and Equality. He was re-appointed to the role in May 2016, having served as Minister of State for European Affairs and Data Protection from July 2014. First elected to Dáil Éireann in February 2011 as the Fine Gael TD for Cork North Central, he was re-elected in February 2016. In 2015 he was elected a Vice President of the European People's Party. During the 31st Dáil, he served as Vice-Chair of the Oireachtas Joint Committee on European Union Affairs and a member of the Joint Committee on Finance, Public Expenditure and Reform. He also served as Chairman of the Fine Gael Committee on European Affairs, Foreign Affairs and Trade. Dara Murphy was Lord Mayor of Cork from 2009 to 2010. He first became a Fine Gael public representative in June 2004 when he was elected as a member of Cork City Council, where he served until 2011. During his time on the City Council he was chair of Cork Policing Committee and was a member of the Cork Docklands Committee. He was appointed to the National Economic and Social Council by former Taoiseach John Bruton for the period 1995 to 1998.



**Pedro PASSOS COELHO,  
President of the PSD**

Pedro Passos Coelho was born in Coimbra, Portugal, on 24 July 1964. He spent his childhood in Angola where his father practised medicine. After the Revolution of 1974 and the independence of the territory, he returned with his family to Portugal and settled in Vila Real, Northern Portugal.

He started very early in politics, as a 14-year-old boy, and had a long and prominent career in the youth branch of the Social Democratic Party (PSD), the JSD, where he was a member of the National Council (1980–1982). As a young student, his academic interests, vocations and ambitions were directed towards a future career in medicine,

in order to follow his father and older sisters' steps, or instead mathematics. However, his largest ambition and vocation revolved around politics.

At the age of 19, Passos Coelho went to Lisbon in order to study mathematics at the University of Lisbon. He was elected vice-president of JSD in 1987, and president in 1991. However, Coelho did not graduate in mathematics by the University of Lisbon. After dropping out the University of Lisbon he would enroll in 1999 for the Lusíada University from where he would be awarded a degree in economics in 2001, when he was 37 years old, and had already been member of the parliament in between 1991–1999. Later, he was elected vice-president of the PSD during the leadership of Luis Marques Mendes (2005–2006) and has also been president of the Municipal Assembly of Vila Real Municipality since 2005; he was a presidential candidate for the PSD in May 2008. Defeated by Manuela Ferreira Leite, he founded, with a group of his supporters, the think-tank Construir Ideias (Building Ideas). On 21 January 2010, his book Mudar ("To Change") was published, and he was again candidate for the leadership of the PSD for the direct elections in March 2010; he was elected president of the PSD on 26 March 2010. Leading to a vote of no confidence that removed the government on 23 March 2011, Passos Coelho won the general election of June, becoming Prime Minister of Portugal. In the 2015 general election, the PSD in coalition with the CDS-PP won but a little short from absolute majority, allowing the Socialist Party to form government with the support of the Left (Bloco de Esquerda and the Communist Party, the Greens and the PAN, a centre-left political party that supports animal rights and environmentalism), pushing away Passos Coelho of his second term less than two months after winning the election. Since then he is the leader of the opposition in the Portuguese national Assembly.



**Francisco PINTO BALSEMÃO,  
Chairman of the General Council of the IFSC and former Portuguese  
Prime Minister**

Francisco Pinto Balsemão was one of the three founders (in 1974) of the Popular Democratic Party (PPD, later renamed Social Democratic Party - PSD). In 1980 he was Minister of State. From 1981 to 1983, Francisco Pinto Balsemão was Prime Minister of Portugal and President of PSD. He has been elected a member of the Portuguese Parliament several terms.

Francisco Pinto Balsemão is a Member of the Portuguese Council of State.

After working as a journalist and then as member of the Board of Diário Popular, from 1963 to 1971, he founded Expresso weekly newspaper in 1973.

Francisco Pinto Balsemão was also the founder, on 1992 of SIC - Sociedade Independente de Comunicação, the first Portuguese private television channel.

Francisco Pinto Balsemão currently serves as Chairman of Impresa Group, a Portuguese holding company with full control of SIC Television Group (owner of the channels SIC, SIC Notícias, SIC Mulher, SIC Radical, SIC Internacional, SIC K, SIC Caras and DStv Kids), Impresa Publishing, SA (owner of the weekly newspaper Expresso and of several magazines, such as Visão, Exame, Exame Informática, Caras, Caras Decoração, Activa, Jornal de Letras, Blitz, TV Mais, Telenovelas, etc.), and InfoPortugal (dedicated to Geographical Information Systems and mobility markets). Impresa also owns 33,33% of Vasp (distribution) and 22,37% of Lusa (National News Agency).



**Sebastian PŁÓCIENNIK,  
PhD habil. in economics, coordinator of the EU – program at the Polish  
Institute of International Affairs (PISM) in Warsaw**

Sebastian Płóciennik, PhD habil. in economics, coordinator of the EU program at the Polish Institute of International Affairs (PISM) in Warsaw. Previously a research fellow at the Wroclaw University and the Willy Brandt Centre for German and European Studies in Wroclaw. His research focuses on the economic system of Germany and the European integration. Author of several dozen publications, among them monographs on the evolution of the German capitalism after the Agenda 2010 reforms and the core-Europe concepts in the German European policy after 1949.

He is a member of the Permanent Council of the Polish-German Forum by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He has taught as a visiting professor at universities in South Africa, Canada, India and Germany.



**Paulo RANGEL MEP,  
EIN Chairman, Vice-Chairman of the EPP Group in the European  
Parliament Responsible for Political Strategy and the European Ideas  
Network**

Paulo Rangel is a Member of the European Parliament since 2009 and vice-chairman of the EPP Group, responsible for the EPP's think tank, European Ideas Network. Since 2015, Mr. Rangel is also vice-chairman of the EPP. Head of the Portuguese PSD Delegation and Administrator of the Robert Schuman Foundation, since 2009. Former Member of the Portuguese Parliament, on the 10th legislature, Mr. Rangel was the Chairman of PSD parliamentary group in 2008-2009. Prior to this, Paulo

Rangel was Deputy Secretary of State in the Ministry of Justice under the 16th constitutional government. Law graduate, by the Catholic University of Oporto. Master's in juridical-political sciences, by the University of Coimbra (in progress), and Doctorate in Public Law, by the Law faculty of Nova University of Lisbon (in progress). Lecturer of the MBA in the Porto Business School. Mr Rangel is a member of the board of directors of the Porto Trade Association, chairman of the General Assembly of RAR Group and regular commentator in various branches of media. Mr. Rangel has made many speeches and lectures, scholarly articles and books on legal, political and constitutional issues, including *Repensar o Poder Judicial*, Publicações Universidade Católica, 2001, *O Estado do Estado*, D. Quixote, 2009. Research work: with the DAAD in Frankfurt, with the European Institute in Florence, the University of Osnabrück, the University of Upsala, the University of Lausanne, the University of Bologna, the University of Genoa and the University of Freiburg. Awarded the Grosse Verdienstkreuz mit Stern by the Federal Republic of German (2009); the Council of Europe's René Cassin Prize (1989); the D. António Ferreira Gomes Prize (1986).



**Luis Filipe REIS,  
CEO SONA E Financial Services**

Born in January 1962, Mr. Reis is graduated in Medicine from the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Coimbra. He took his MBA from ISEE at the University of Porto. He holds a PhD in Economic and Business Sciences from the Universidad Complutense de Madrid. Attended the Stanford Executive Program at Stanford University. He is Executive Director and COO of Sonaecom, since May 2000 and May 2004, respectively. He also holds the Presidency of Apritel (Association of Telecommunications Operators). He is also a member of the General Council of Jornal Público. Previously he was a member of the Board of Directors of Modelo Continente SGPS and Marketing Director of Sona e Distribuição, which he held between October 1994 and May 2000. He was also President of Banco Universo. He is also invited professor and coordinator of the Marketing classes of the General Management Course and MBA of the Management School of Porto.



**Pedro REIS,  
Chairman of the Instituto Francisco Sá Carneiro (IFSC)**

Graduated in Business Administration and Management from the Universidade Católica Portuguesa, completed his academic training at Harvard Business School in the United States, Strategic Finance (2005), Insead (France) at the AMP - Advanced Management Program (1995) and also at Catholic University in the PAGE - Advanced Management Program for Executives (1994-95).

He was the Chairman of AICEP Portugal from December 2011 to April 2014. He has been a manager and consultant of companies for more than 20 years in various sectors such as furniture, engineering, advertising and communication. Mr. Reis also the Executive Secretariat of the Strategic Economic Internationalization Council (CEIE). Mr. Reis also is part of the National Council for Entrepreneurship and Innovation and participates in the Economic and Investment Affairs Coordination Meeting (RCAEI), coordinating the Permanent Commission for Investor Support (CEPIP). Member of the General and Supervisory Board of Portugal Ventures and, by appointment and chairs the Jury of the "More Economic Diplomacy" Award. Since 2016, he is the Chairman of the Francisco Sá Carneiro Institute.

Head of Team Economic Policy,  
Department Politics and Consulting, Konrad Adenauer Stiftung, Berlin**

Matthias Schäfer was born in 1968 in Stuttgart, Germany. He studied law and business administration at the Eberhard Karls University in Tübingen. From 1994 to 1995 he was a freelance employee of Kienbaum Unternehmensberatung Düsseldorf in the Public Sector. Daniel Schwammenthal studied political science and political economy at the University of Aachen and received an M.A. in international relations and international communication from Boston University and an L.L.M. in European law and policy from the University of Manchester.
